- 1. How can we improve these meetings? How would you like them to work?
- Activities ice breakers
- Have tables with the different schools split amongst the tables in common year groups
- Play the 'Pirate Game' to get everyone interacting and compete against other tables

- Have an 'Escape Room' paper activity to get people to work as a team so they feel more confident about sharing ideas
- Have a guiz to build team spirit

2. Our book - how can we tell more people about it?

- Promote it in assemblies
- Run a charity event to raise funds to buy copies of the book for school
- Put the book on the school websites
- In RSHE lessons use the book as a tool to promote learning and discussion about learning differences
- Make it prominent at Parent's Evenings maybe with SEND department
- Produce a version of the book for younger children and create a reading challenge
- Advertise it on adult platforms such as FaceBook

3. Physical exercise - how does it help young people?

- It gets you moving and wakes you up
- Helps you get into shape
- Improves mental health
- Because it helps your brain it also helps motivate you in other areas such as revising/learning
- It improves confidence
- Strengthens bones
- Makes you more expressive
- Builds teamwork
- To help those that are not interested in physical exercise we could try out new sports for challenges
- Be given general cardio exercises you could do at home without the need for specialist equipment
- Have more form team games on the field
- Modify the dress code so we can wear suitable clothing in different weather conditions

- Create House competitions with physical games in the format of video games - like completing different 'levels'
- Build a more competitive element with prizes
- Run cross country events off the school site at local parks
- Have gym accessibility in ALL schools that can be used at lunchtime and after school - we have the motivation but no outlet - public gyms are out of our price range
- Have starter challenges in PE and mini challenges to help everyone achieve something
- Have a vote on the sports you are able to study
- Have rugby on the curriculum for girls
- Have football available to girls in ALL years

4. What helps build your self-confidence? What motivates you? What builds your resilience?

- Running and walking making myself exercise getting my body and mind fit for my future long-term goals
- I get self-confidence from the support of others around me
- Getting to know other people and building up a support network
- Respect builds confidence
- Praise makes me feel good and motivates me to continue
- Small steps to achieve helps build confidence and motivation
- Never give up there is no such thing as failure FAIL=FIRST ATTEMPT IN LEARNING
- Individual support when finding something difficult helps build resilience
- Recognising my own strengths and building on them
- Shouting at people and putting them down has a negative effect and stops motivation and causes lack of self-confidence
- Kindness towards others kindness and respect builds everyone's confidence

5. Video - we want to capture what we do - how are we going to do it?

- Start with words of encouragement about everyone striving to do their best
- Show young people doing lots of different events and activities that the MSC do - lots of clips
- Have mini interviews with Young People and their roles in MSC
- Use bright colours
- Make it bright and uplifting
- Another song would be good
- Include information about how many schools are involved in the MSC
- Advertise the book in the video
- Make sure it is accessible to all young people
- Make it no longer than 5 minutes to capture and keep attention
